Dear Colonel Talbot:

I have your letter of 11 October 1949 with reference to the final disposition of CIL cases.

Our interpretation of the provisions of paragraph 6 of letter, Department of Army, OCMG, file OCMG 293, subject "Disinterment Discrepancies" dated 9 November 1948, has been that we are required to forward to your office the information on these particular graves upon completion of the final burials of CIL Unknowns. We have to date made certain burials of CIL Unknowns in accordance with the authority contained in your Cable WCL 29561 dated 14 December 1948 as follows:

a. Group One, U.S. Military Cemetery Cambridge: CIL Unknowns from Cambridge, Lisnabreeny and Brookwood have been interred as Unknown X-100, Permanent Cemetery at Cambridge, in Plot E, Row O, Grave 16.

b. Group Two, U.S. Military Cemetery St. Laurent: CIL Unknowns from St. Laurent, Druguignan, Laynes, St. Andre, La Cambe, Ste. Mere Eglise #1, Ste. Mere Eglise #2 and Bloisville, have been interred as Unknown X-99, Permanent Cemetery at St. Laurent, in Plot B, Row 1, Grave 18. CIL Unknowns from St. James, Villeneuve, St. Cornelle, Gorron, Le Chene Guerin and Marigny, have been interred as Unknown X-103, Permanent Cemetery at St. Laurent, in Plot A, Row 1, Grave 18.

It is now planned to consolidate and inter the remaining CIL Unknowns for 20 temporary cemeteries at U.S. Military Cemetery Neuville. By this action the CIL Unknowns originally planned for burial at U.S. Military Cemetery St. Avoird will eliminate Group Three burials.

Experience has proven that CIL portions of remains, as consolidated into CIL Unknowns, should be the last burials accomplished since they are involved in identification processing and discrepancies. Therefore, it is not contemplated to bury the CIL Unknowns at Neuville until the cemetery is ready for turn-over to the American Battle Monuments Commission, at which time your office will be immediately notified.

I have your letter of 11 October 1949 with reference to the final disposition of CIL cases.

Our interpretation of the provisions of paragraph 6 of letter, Department of Army, OQIG, file QIGMP 293, subject "Disinterment Discrepancies" dated 9 November 1948, has been that we are required to forward to your office the information on these particular graves upon completion of the final burials of CIL Unknowns. We have to date made certain burials of CIL Unknowns in accordance with the authority contained in your cable WGL 29551 dated 14 December 1948 as follows:

a. Group One, U.S. Military Cemetery Cambridge: CIL Unknowns from Cambridge, Lisnabreeny and Brookwood have been interred as Unknown X-100, Permanent Cemetery at Cambridge, in Plot E, Row C, Grave 16.

b. Group Two, U.S. Military Cemetery St. Laurent: CIL Unknowns from St. Laurent, Draguignan, Laynes, St. Andre, La Cambe, Ste. Mere Eglise #1, Ste. Mere Eglise #2 and Bloisville, have been interred as Unknown X-99, Permanent Cemetery at St. Laurent, in Plot B, Row 1, Grave 18. CIL Unknowns from St. James, Villeneuve, St. Conaille, Gorron, Le Chene Guerin and Marigny, have been interred as Unknown X-103, Permanent Cemetery at St. Laurent, in Plot A, Row 1, Grave 18.

It is now planned to consolidate and inter the remaining CIL Unknowns for 20 temporary cemeteries at U.S. Military Cemetery Neuville. By this action the CIL Unknowns originally planned for burial at U.S. Military Cemetery St. Avold will eliminate Group Three burials.

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Experience has proven that CIL portions of remains, as consolidated into CIL Unknowns, should be the last burials accomplished since they are involved in identification processing and discrepancies. Therefore, it is not contemplated to bury the CIL Unknowns at Neuville until the cemetery is ready for turn-over to the American Battle Monuments Commission, at which time your office will be immediately notified.

Dear Colonel Raguse:

I have your letter of 6 October with reference to the final disposal of CIL cases, for which please accept our thanks.

It is requested that your people comply with the provisions of paragraph 6 of letter, this Office, File QMGMP 293, Subject: Disinterment Discrepancies, dated 9 November 1948, which is as follows:

"Immediately following the burial of CIL unknowns within each area or independent zone, this office should be advised by air mail letter concerning the circumstances involved, including the number of CIL unknowns interred, the X-number or numbers assigned, the burial location, and any other information which in the judgment of the AGRS commander should be on record in this office."

It is necessary to have this information so these particular graves can be flagged to make them ineligible for the selection of the Unknown Serviceman.

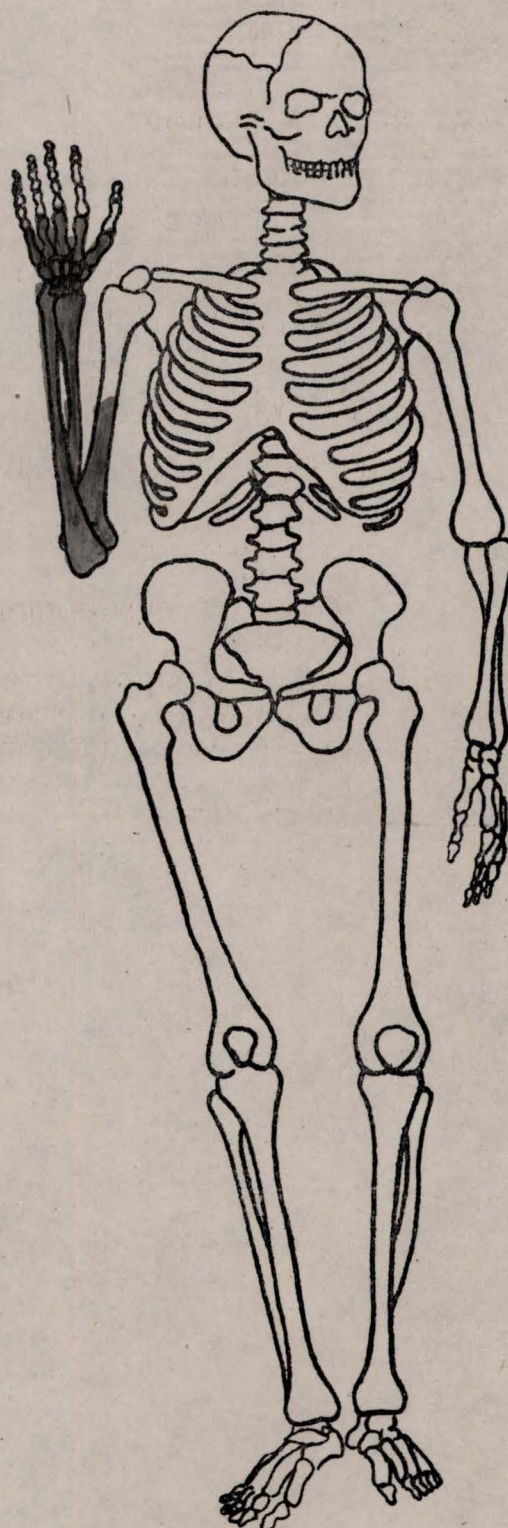

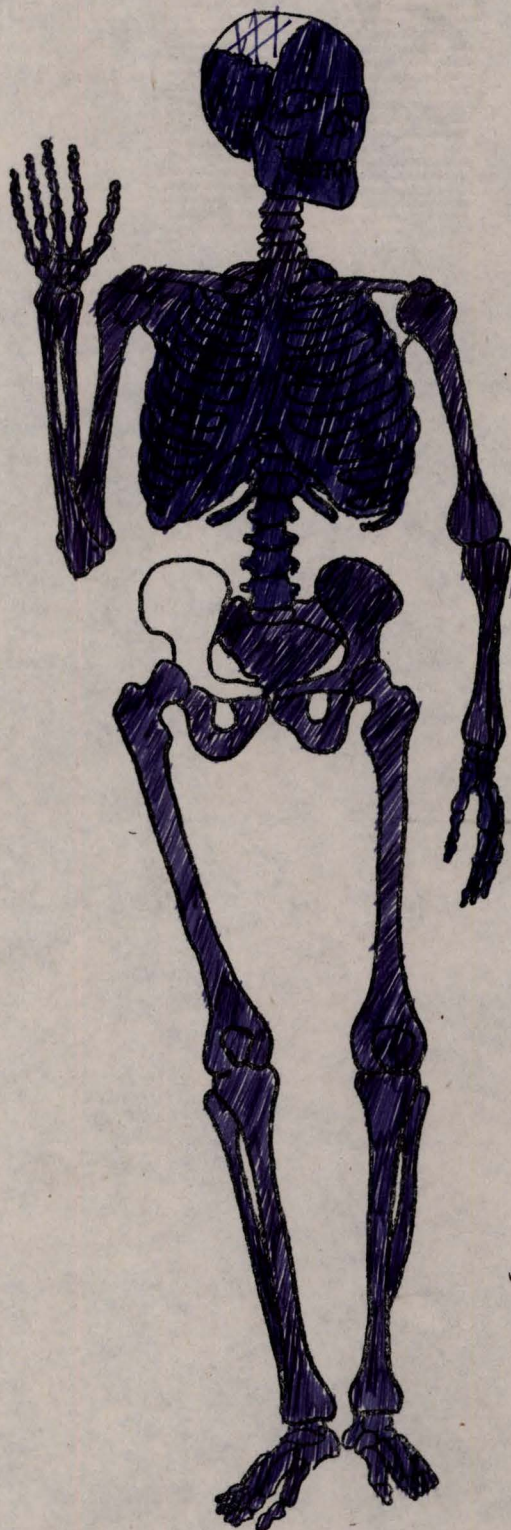
