Dear Mr. Simmons:

The Department of the Army desires that you be informed of the final determination of the investigation in the case of your son, the late Corporal George G. Simmons.

Full consideration has been given to all available information pertaining to your son since he died while a prisoner of the Japanese Government. According to information obtained from the Cabanatuan Prisoner of War Death Report, your son died as a result of amoebic dysentery at Cabanatuan Prisoner of War Camp, Luzon, Philippine Islands.

Subsequent to the reported death of your son, units of the American Graves Registration Service disinterred all remains from the Cabanatuan Prisoner of War Cemetery and removed them to the American Graves Registration Service Mausoleum, Manila, Philippine Islands. In an effort to establish and/or verify identifications, these remains were subjected to exhaustive investigations, including processing by anthropologists and medical, dental and laboratory technicians in our Central Identification Laboratory at Manila. Our investigations have been completed and it is with regret that I must inform you that it has been impossible to identify any of the recovered remains as those of your son.



After a detailed study of the negative results of the investigations and the pertinent facts regarding the case, the Department of the Army has been forced to conclude that the remains of your son are not recoverable. I wish to assure you that, should any additional evidence come to our attention indicating that his remains are in our possession, you will be informed immediately.

Realizing the extent of your grief and anxiety, it is not easy to express condolence to you who gave your loved one under circumstances so difficult that there is no grave at which to pay homage. May the knowledge of your son's honorable service to his country be a source of sustaining comfort to you.

BASIS FOR DECLARING REMAINS NON-RECOVERABLE

1. Attached extracted copies of two (2) Cabanatuan POW Camp rosters indicate that the above listed personnel died at Cabanatuan POW Camp, Province of Nueva Ecija, Philippine Islands on 19 November 1942. This information is in agreement with the data shown on the attached OQMG Forms 371, except for Cpl. John W. Ruark, 278 681, and Pvt. Charlie M. Waid, 19 049 058, who were determined dead as of 9 July 1943 and 9 November 1943, respectively.

2. Investigation of these cases reveal the following information:

a. Subject personnel are indicated on "Cabanatuan POW Camp Death Report" to have been buried together with five (5) other casualties in Communal Grave No. 717, Cabanatuan POW Cemetery. This grave has been disinterred and resulted in the recovery of fourteen (14) remains; four (4) of which are "Knowns" and ten (10) as "Unknowns". The ten (10) unidentified remains have previously been recommended for individual and group identifications as the remains of YORK, George Sr., Civ. Employee, and the above listed personnel, respectively. These recommendations, however, were disapproved per OQMG letter dated 10 November 1949.

Cabanatuan POW Camp Casualties.

b. Due to the absence of OQMG Form 371 for George York Sr., Navy Civilian Employee, same is not being considered by this Board as non-recoverable.

c. It has not been possible to definitely associate the above listed personnel with any other remains recovered from Cabanatuan POW Camp Cemetery.

3. Findings and recommendations are based on all information presently available.

4. It is recommended that the remains of the above listed casualties be considered non-recoverable and that all records pertaining to search for and recovery of their remains be closed.

2. After a careful review of this case it has been determined that the dental and physical evidence presented is not sufficiently conclusive to prove the individual recommendation or to substantiate the group recommendation. The association of these decedents with these Unknown remains is based upon information contained in the Cabanatuan POW Camp Death Report. Experience with this report has proved it to be a valuable aid for the association of decedents with Unknown remains. However, in repeated instances, it has been shown that the report does not constitute substantive proof within itself. Therefore, it is subject to qualifying or substantiating comparisons of dental and physical data.

It is with reluctance that I write to you about your son, Cpl. George G. Simmons, 19019886, who died as a prisoner of war in the Philippine Islands.

There has been forwarded to this office a burial form for a deceased member of the Armed Forces with certain identifying information which leads us to believe the remains might possibly be those of your loved one. A dental chart was included with the burial report showing fillings and missing teeth. This work was apparently performed by a civilian dentist.

It will be of the utmost value to this office if you can secure from the civilian dentist who treated the decedent, a copy of the chart which is usually retained by him as a matter of record, and which usually shows work performed for each patient.

A self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, is inclosed for your convenience.





