Colonel., O-005 881BASIS FOR DECLARING REMAINS NON-RECOVERABLE

1. Attached OQMG Form 371 indicates that Col. Loren P. Stewart, O-005 881, was killed in action on 13 January 1942 in the Philippine Islands.
2. Further investigation reveals the following information:
 - a. There is no record in this Office relative to Col. Stewart's specific place of death or burial.
 - b. The remains of the subject officer have not been recovered as a "Known" during the final and/or prior area search and recovery operations conducted by American Graves Registration Service Search and Recovery teams in the Philippine Islands. (These include disinterments from all known military cemeteries and all known burials of military personnel from civilian and Prisoner of War Camp cemeteries.)
 - c. The Japanese Army, during its three years of occupation, made many efforts to blot out American handiwork in the Philippine Islands. They obliterated markers, burned crosses and plot maps, death registers, etc. Natural disintegration under tropical conditions has completed the ruin of reliable means of identification for many remains recovered from this area.
 - d. It has not been possible to definitely associate the subject officer with any remains recovered from the provinces of Bataan, Pampanga, Tarlac, Nueva Ecija, Rizal and the Corregidor Islands Group. Identification data for all applicable unknowns recovered from these areas have been compared with the identifying data shown on the attached OQMG Form 371, but the results were negative.

3. Findings and recommendations are based on all information presently available.

4. It is recommended that the remains of Col. Loren P. Stewart, O-005 881, be considered non-recoverable and that all records pertaining to search for and recovery of his remains be closed.

Dear Master Sergeant Yatzek:

It has been almost a year since I spoke to you by telephone regarding my grandfather, Colonel Loren P. Stewart, Infantry 05 881, who was killed on January 12, 1942, near Hacienda Abucay in the Philippine Islands. At the time of his death, Colonel Stewart was in command of the 51st Infantry, Philippine Army. To my knowledge, and that of other members of the family (including my grandmother), neither Colonel Stewart's body nor any of his personal effects were recovered.


Subsequent to our discussion, I was in contact with Master Sergeant Abie Abraham, who after the war was in charge of disintering graves of the Americans killed on Bataan. Attached is a copy of Master Sergeant Abraham's letter to me.

Since Master Sergeant Abraham has indicated that he forwarded the remains with the informant report to Fort McKinley, I am wondering if you could provide me with the information on how this was followed up?

Dear John:

Good hearing from you. it's always good hearing from the families of my friends. I knew your grandfather very well.

I spent a week trying to locate the grave of your grandfather. finally an informant came to my office in Balanga, were I had my office and he gave me this information.

During the battle of Abucay's hacienda, I went to my plantation at the Hacienda to check how things were. I saw Filipinos carrying a deceased American. they didn't talk much, but did tell me that it was an American Colonel. I watched the Filipinos bury the Colonel.

John, I believe it was Colonel Stewart, as he was the only Colonel to be killed at the Hacienda. my outfit, the 31st Infantry was on the right flank of the 51st Division.

I sent to body to the American cemetery as an unknown(probably that of Colonel Stewart) due to no tags were found with the remains, but did send the statement that Mr. Caragay gave me and was hoping that the remains would be properly identified later.

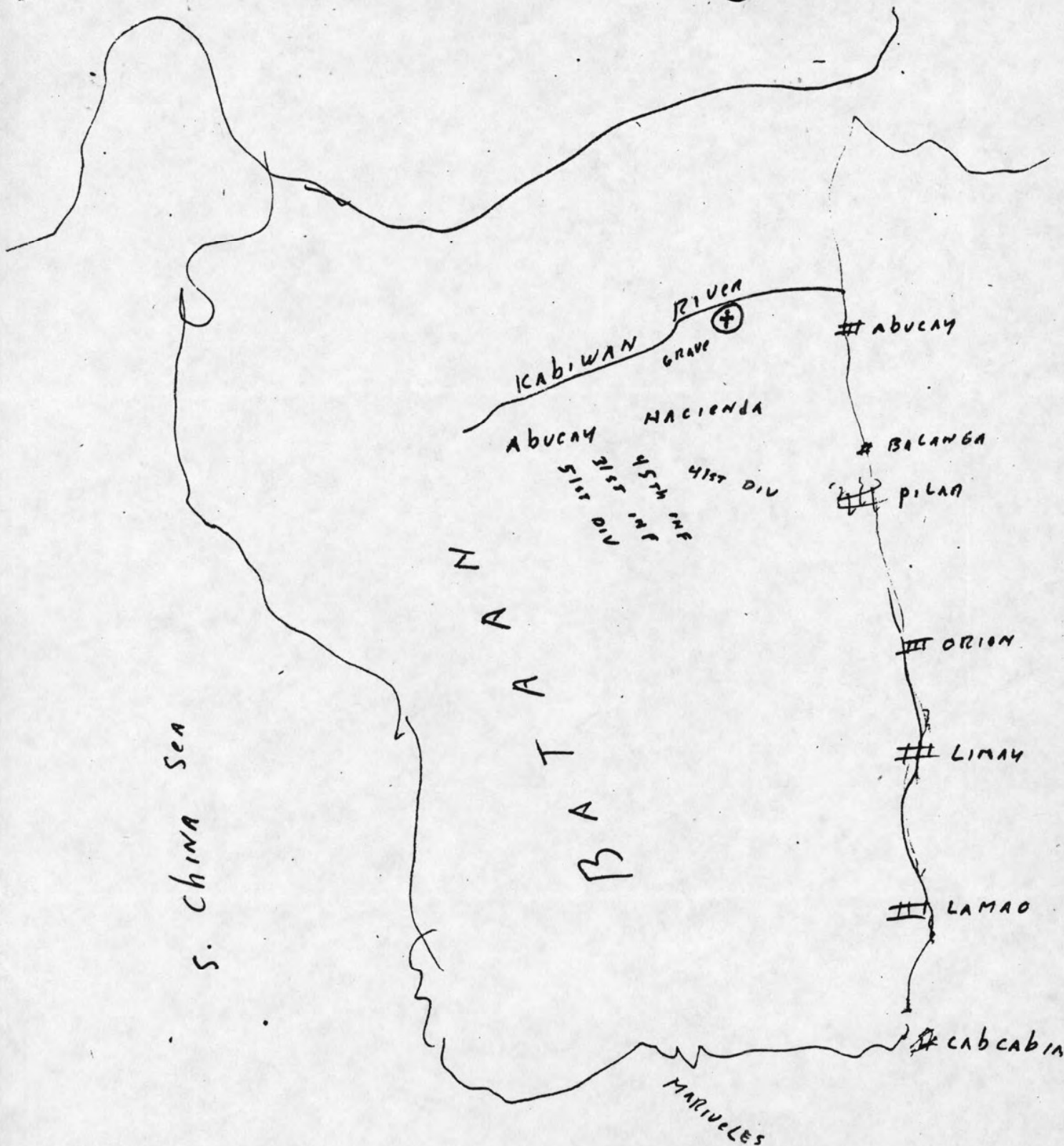
I was the chief of all operations and the only American in Bataan. didn't want anyone to fool around with the operations, as they might disinter Japanese and say they were Americans.


It has come to my attention that certain additional administrative requirements may have been added in recent years and that a new process may exist to formally request that Colonel Stewart's remains be identified and returned to the United States for burial.

Records previously provided to me indicate that Colonel Stewart, despite substantial evidence to the contrary, is still registered by your organization as non-recoverable.

That history notwithstanding I would request the remains be identified – using the DNA sample provided two years ago by Scott Stewart - to supplement the first person accounts previously provided.

This request is being made in my role as both Colonel Stewart's grandson and the designated Next of Kin. My first request was made June 19, 1981

The Past Conflict Repatriations Branch has received your request for the disinterment of Colonel Loren P. Stewart. We have forwarded this request to the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA).

I would like to explain the process for a disinterment request so you will know what to expect. The Army Casualty Office forwards the request to the DPAA who will task the appropriate sections to analyze the request and make a recommendation regarding disinterment. DPAA consolidates all recommendations and forwards the request and coordinated recommendations to the Assistant Secretary of Defense (Manpower and Reserve Affairs). The Assistant Secretary of Defense (Manpower and Reserve Affairs) is the final consenting authority.

DPAA's goal for working this request is 150 days. Army Casualty will be in contact you every 90 days, or when there is a major change in status. Please contact us at any time if you would like an update.
