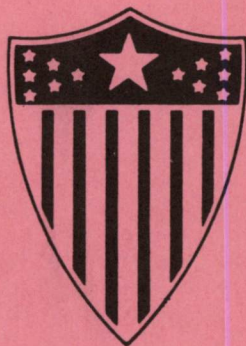

BASIS FOR DECLARING REMAINS NON-RECOVERABLE

1. According to available information, 1st Lt. David W. Maynard, O-384 762, was killed in action on 11 Jan 1942 at Abucay, Bataan, Philippine Islands.
2. Investigation of the case reveals subject officer's remains as having been buried behind the south wall of the Abucay Churchyard, Abucay, Bataan, however identification data for all unknowns disinterred from subject place of burial has been considered insufficient to establish the identity of any of the subject remains to be those of the above named officer.
3. Findings and recommendations are based on all presently available information.
4. It is recommended that the remains of 1st Lt. David W. Maynard, O-384 762, be considered non-recoverable and that all records pertaining to search and recovery of his remains be closed.

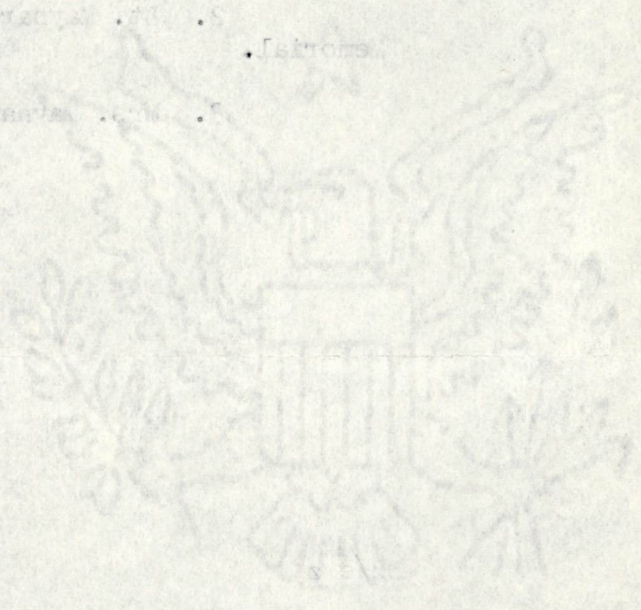

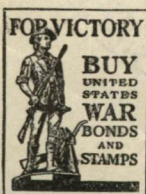

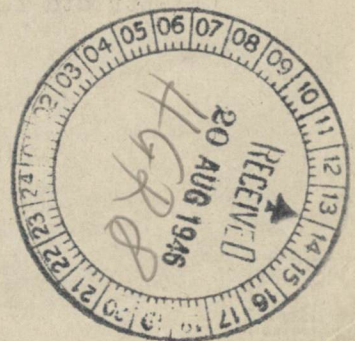

We received a letter from your office stating that they had no record of the burial place of our Son which certainly was a surprise, We have waited five years for information confirming reports from other sources as to his grave.

For your information a quotation from Col George S. Clarke of the 57th Infantry

"Davids remains were brought back to the Church in the town of Abucay, Province of Bataan, P.I. Five of my brave, young officers were buried on that same day in that same Church Yard. Chaplain Scecina performed the burial rites.

For your personal information, David is buried in Grave #6 behind the South wall of the Abacuy Church, in the Churchyard."

This letter has practically been confirmed by Maj. Franklin O Anders also of the 57th Infantry. I quote Maj. Anders,

"In the first four days we lost your Son Lt. David Maynard, Lieut Ken Wilson, Lt Compton, Lt Green Lt Nininger, and Capt Meyer.

Father Scecina conducted Services at the graves of American Officers killed at Mabatang in the Abucay Church Yard."

I know the Church at Abucay was destroyed, but boys who came back from the prison camps, state that on the death march they saw five or six graves with markers at the Abucay Church.

I believe these facts will give you something to work on, Mrs Maynard requested a information pamphlet (the Gold Star Mothers received Some copies) which your office was reluctant to send, I suppose they are reserved for a few, but not all Gold Star Mothers.

1. Transmitted herewith for reply to the writer by your office, is letter received from Mr. Herbert B. Maynard, father of 1st Lieutenant David W. MAYNARD, O-384762, in which information is requested concerning the remains of his son.

2. Records of this Headquarters do not indicate Lt. MAYNARD recovered as a known, however, recent investigation discloses the fact that Unknown X-1359 AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, Hangar 812, Bay J, Crypt 3134, formerly Unknown X-3566 USAF Cemetery Manila #2 was originally recovered from Guitol 33rd Infantry P. A. Cemetery, Bataan, P. I., a six grave cemetery near Abucay and toothchart for Unknown X-1359 coincides with that of Lt. MAYNARD. Your attention is invited to copies of QMC Form 1045, Interrogation Sheet dated 7 October 1946 and sketch of recovery location, attached as inclosures to this letter.

3. Recommendation is being forwarded to the Philcom Zone Board of Review that Unknown X-1359 USAF Mausoleum, Manila, be identified as the remains of Lt. MAYNARD.

4. Your attention is further invited to the attached sketch of the interments at the Abucay Church mentioned in Mr. Maynard's letter. Identification research indicates that the remains of Lt. MAYNARD are not among those recovered from this burial location.

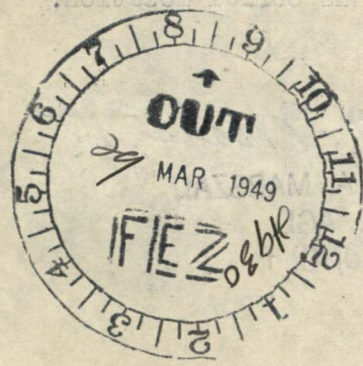
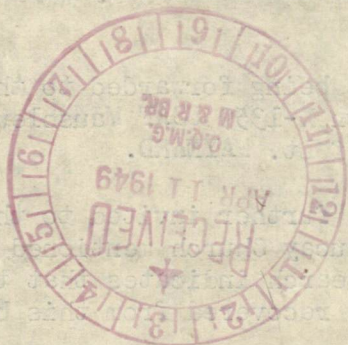

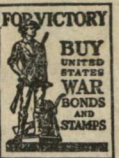

1. Reference is made to request for dental comparison of War Department records of 1st Lt. David W. Maynard, O-384762, with Unknowns X-1051-2-4, X-1055-6 and X-3431, Manila No. 2, for possible identification.
2. Dental records on file for Lt. Maynard shows only two missing third molars. Since, up to the present time, efforts to secure further dental information from West Point or a civilian source have been unsuccessful, it is impossible to state whether or not one of these Unknowns is the remains of subject officer.
3. Unknown X-3431 is also under investigation as possible remains of 1st Lt. John C. Compton, O-413755, who was a member of Lt. Maynard's Organization and was killed around the same time. A civilian dental chart is being awaited by this office. Upon receipt and comparison your office will be advised.

I am glad Dad McManis told you to write to me, probably Dad told you that I was the only one who remained in the Philippines, I stayed two extra years and returned home in 1947.

I established my headquarters in Balanga, Bataan, this spot is in the center of Bataan and from here I could work at any spot in Bataan, I worked according to leads, investigation revealed that there were 6 Officers buried at Guitol, Balanga, Guitol is not far from the Abucay battle line, I disinterred the 6 and did not find any tags, the only thing I can do is take the remains to the Cemetery in Manila as unknowns, the bodies will remain as unknowns till they properly identify the deceased, I know Washington is doing all they can and probably later will secure the real identity, as I recall I sent in a lead on the 6 bodies as that of Lt David Manard, Maj Kaplan, Major Cleary, etc.

As for the burials at Abucay cemetery, I identified 9 as scouts I Americal Capt. whose name is Captain McCurdy and the other American as probable that of Lt Compton, as for Lt Wilson, he was disinterred at Hermosa Bataan.

Hoping this information helps you out a lot, anything else I can help, just write to me and let me know.

2. Unknown X-1572 was recovered from an isolated grave in Hermosa, Bataan, P.I., and recommended for identification on the basis of information furnished by Mr. Jose Yondoc, a Philippine citizen. The next of kin of Lt Wilson were provided with the facts of this case, however, they were in possession of certain information which they believe, and which contradicts the statement of Mr. Yondoc. This information is forwarded to your headquarters in Inclosure #3 and is an extract of a statement by Mr. Lee C. Brooks, formerly Lt Brooks and later Major Brooks, who was a close personal friend of Lt Wilson and was at Abucay at the time Lt Wilson was killed.

3. Unknown X-4685 was recovered from Grave #9, Soldiers Row, Abucay Cemetery, Abucay, P.I. A letter from the father of Lt David W. Maynard, O-38762, indicates that Lieutenants Maynard, Wilson, Compton, Green and Nininger, and Capt Meyer were interred in the churchyard at Abucay. Burials of these men were under the supervision of a Chaplain Secina.

4. This Office has succeeded in contacting Lt Col John W. Raulston, M.C., who was in command of the medical collecting station located in the Catholic Church at Agucay. He has furnished a diagram showing the approximate location of burials performed by Chaplain Secina. An extract of his statement and diagram are also attached.

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Maynard:

It is with deep regret that I find it necessary to inform you of the final determination made in the case of your son, the late First Lieutenant David W. Maynard.

Full consideration has been given to all available information pertaining to your son, since he was killed in action on 11 January 1942, at Abucay, Bataan, Philippine Islands. According to information in our files, the remains of your son were buried behind the south wall of the Abucay Churchyard, Abucay, Bataan. The area in which his remains were buried has been over run several times by enemy troops and, due to heavy artillery fire from both forces in this area, no trace of the grave could be found after the fighting ceased.

Subsequent to that time, units of the American Graves Registration Service thoroughly searched the area in which your son was killed; however, no trace could be found of his remains. In order to determine whether the remains of your son had been recovered, a check was made of the records of all the cemeteries throughout the vicinity in which he was reported killed, but no information pertaining to the location of his remains could be found. In a further attempt to locate the remains of your son, identifying data pertaining to him was compared with all available identifying data for unidentified remains recovered from the vicinity of Bataan, Philippine Islands and the Abucay Churchyard; however, this comparison also failed to reveal any remains which could be identified as those of your son.

After full consideration of all available information and, in view of the fact that the extensive investigations conducted by our forces in the field failed to reveal any trace of the remains of your son, the Department of the Army has been forced to conclude that his remains are not recoverable. I wish to assure you that, should any additional

evidence come to our attention indicating that your son's remains are in our possession, you will be informed immediately.

Thoroughly understanding the extent of the grief and distress you will experience upon receipt of this information, it is not easy to express condolence. It is my sincere hope, however, that the knowledge of your son's honorable service to his country may be a source of sustaining comfort to you who gave your loved one under circumstances so difficult that there is no grave at which to pay homage.

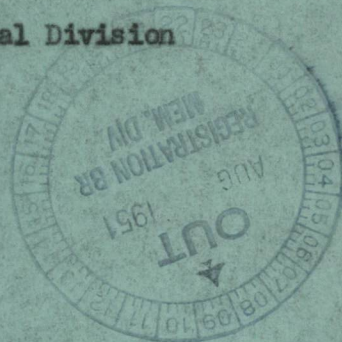

I am in receipt of your letter dated 25 August 1956 in which you make inquiry relative to a memorial marker, commemorating your son, the late First Lieutenant David William Maynard.

Inclosed is a leaflet concerning the erection of memorial markers in national cemeteries which defines those eligible for memorialization, the procedure for securing approval for erection of a marker, and the person authorized to make application therefor. You will note that your son may be memorialized under provisions of Public Law 675, as amended by Public Law 651, and that such markers must be provided and erected at private expense.

A section in the Arlington National Cemetery has been set aside to be used exclusively for the erection of memorial markers. I am inclosing specifications (marked "C") concerning the memorial markers that may be erected in this area.

Since all costs incident to this memorial will be at private expense, it will be necessary for the next of kin to engage a monument firm of their choice to do the work. The firm selected should submit a scale drawing of the proposed monument with full size sketch of details to the Office of The Quartermaster General for approval, together with a statement, signed by the next of kin, authorizing such firm to manufacture and erect the monument. A plot will be assigned at the time the monument is approved.

The government does not recommend nor furnish lists of monument firms. Inasmuch as you indicate that you would like to communicate with a monument firm in this vicinity, it is suggested that you contact the Washington Board of Trade, 1616 "K" Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C., for information.

Under the provisions of Public Law 871-80th Congress, the name of your son will be inscribed on the wall of a chapel or other appropriate



memorial to be erected in the Pacific Area. This law provides that the names and service data of those who died while serving overseas on or after 3 September 1939 and whose remains were not recovered, or identified, or were buried at sea, shall be inscribed on the wall of a chapel or other appropriate memorial to be erected to their memory.

The American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington, D. C., is currently in the process of planning the memorials and preparing lists of the names to be inscribed in the various overseas cemeteries. I have been informed by the Commission that Lieutenant Maynard will be memorialized in the United States Military Cemetery, Fort McKinley, Manila, Republic of the Philippines.

I trust the foregoing and the leaflets provide you with the desired information.

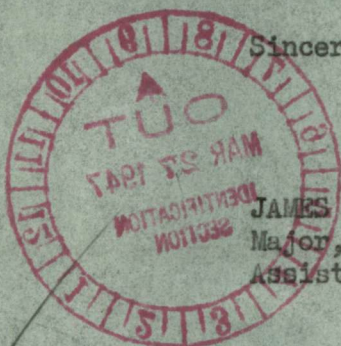

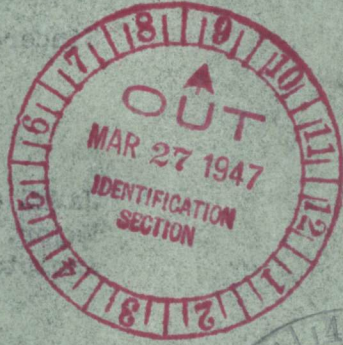

It is with deep regret that you are advised that, up to the present time, information pertaining to the burial of the remains of your son has not been received in this office. An inquiry is being made to obtain information regarding his remains. Upon completion of this inquiry you will be advised as to the results.

The War Department has now been authorized to remove, at Government expense, to the final resting place designated by the next of kin, the remains of those American citizens who died while serving overseas with our armed forces during this war.

When the necessary preliminaries have been completed, a letter with an information pamphlet and a "Request for Disposition" form attached will be sent to the next of kin of those American dead. The "Request for Disposition" form, when properly filled out, will constitute the formal expression of the next of kin's detailed desires. Since letters to next of kin will be dispatched automatically and according to the records here, communications with this office regarding this subject will not be necessary.

As you probably know, the supply of steel for the manufacture of caskets, is at present uncertain. Without this essential item, the movement of remains cannot properly be initiated. This fact and the necessity for complete coordination of movement in many parts of the

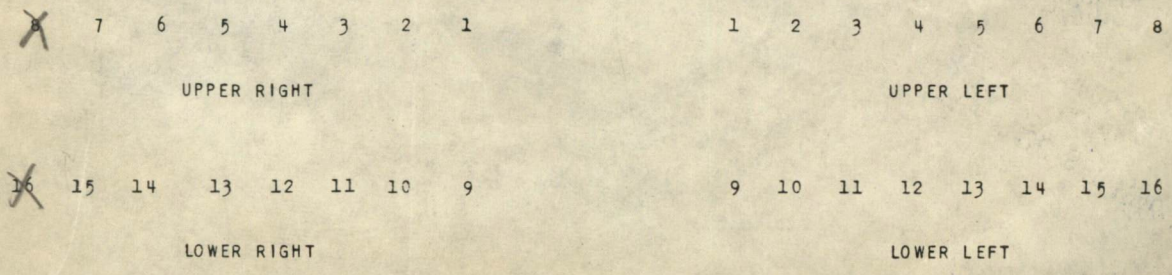
